


# MISSISSIPPI STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FUNCTIONAL ORGANIZATIONAL CHART



# CHANGES IN REGULATIONS FISCAL YEAR 2018

## JULY 2017

- **Final Adoption of Minimum Standards of Operation for Post-Acute Residential Brain Injury Rehabilitation Facilities (RBIR)**

Established minimum standards for regulation of Post-Acute Residential Brain Injury Rehabilitation Facilities (RBIR), requirements for inspection and licensing, admissions criteria, required services and physical plant.

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to the Regulations Governing the Licensure of Child Care Facilities**

Amended the regulations to increase to 60 minutes the amount of time that toddlers are required to engage in physical activity.

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to the Regulations Governing the Licensure of Child Care Facilities for 12 or Fewer Children in the Operators' Home**

Amended the regulations to increase to 60 minutes the amount of time that toddlers are required to engage in physical activity.

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to the On-site Wastewater Regulations**

Amended the regulations to modify the fees and clarified that the Mississippi State Department of Health, rather than by the counties, conduct wastewater inspections.

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Food Protection--Milk and Dairy Regulations**

Amended the regulations to modify fees.

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Food Protection—Food Safety Regulations**

Amended the regulations to modify fees and deleted Appendix A "Food Processing Risk Assessment."

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Trauma System of Care Regulations**

Amended the regulations to clarify some provisions e.g.: delete the definition of "Bypass;" add the definition of "Diversion;" revise timeline for Initial Trauma/Burn Center designation; provide that education visits may be conducted by telephone/video conferencing; clarified Trauma Center Designation process; clarification of Inter-facility Transfer regulations; require that general surgeons taking trauma call have eight (8) hours of trauma specific continuing medical education over three years in Level I Trauma Centers; clarified regulations regarding Surgical Suites/Anesthesia; clarified regulations regarding Intensive Care Unit; clarified that on-call surgeon must be dedicated to the trauma center and not on-call at any other hospital in Level II Trauma Centers; clarified requirement for hospital policy defining conditions requiring the trauma surgeon's presence in Level III Trauma Centers .

# CHANGES IN REGULATIONS FISCAL YEAR 2018

- **Final Adoption of the Minimum Standards for the ST Elevated Myocardial Infarction (STEMI) System of Care.**  
Established minimum standards for regulation of the STEMI System of Care.
- **Final Adoption of Regulations for the Control of Radiation in Mississippi**  
Amended regulations to adopt by reference some provisions of 21 CFR Part 900, Subpart B §900 and, require that any additional information provided in mammography reports be evidence based, consistent with accepted medical standards and the FDA's Mammography Quality Standards Act.

## January 2018

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Food Protection—Food Safety Regulations**  
Amended regulations to modify fees.
- **Final Adoption of Amendments to the Public Water Supply—Regulations Governing Fluoridation of Community Water Supplies**  
Amended regulations to reflect recommended fluoride levels consistent with federal fluoridation recommendations and adjusted fluoride sampling for consistency with existing public water system classification standards
- **Final Adoption of Amendments to the Public Water Supply—Regulation Governing the Certification of Municipal and Domestic Water System Operators**  
Amended the regulations to clarify specific operational terms and updated the waterworks operator certification requirements.
- **Final Adoption of Amendments to the Public Water Supply—Mississippi Primary Drinking Water Regulation**  
Amended regulations to be consistent with federal regulations.
- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Emergency Medical Services Regulations**  
Amended regulations to reflect an additional level of ground ambulance service, implemented updated education curriculum for EMTs and Paramedics, and grandfathered in Medical Directors with appropriate experience in lieu of board certification in emergency medicine.
- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Trauma System of Care Regulations**  
Amended regulations to change the title of an appendix listing the minimum essential and desirable elements for a trauma center, and amended an appendix providing trauma team activation guidance for consistency with the current American College of Surgeons recommendations.
- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Regulations for Control of Radiation in Mississippi**  
Amended regulations to be consistent with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Agreement program.
- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Minimum Standards for Hospice**  
Amended regulations to require a standardized mechanism for recording scheduled medications and a standardized program for the collection and disposal of all medications upon a patient's death.

# CHANGES IN REGULATIONS FISCAL YEAR 2018

April 2018

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to Regulations Governing Licensure of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists**

Amended regulations to reflect the requirement of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association that all audiologists are required to receive a doctoral degree to qualify for certification. .

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to the Mississippi STEMI System of Care Regulations**

Amended regulations to specify that a hospital accredited as a Mission: Lifeline STEMI Receiving Center or by another approved nationally recognized organization that provides STEMI Receiving Center accreditation will be automatically added to the list of STEMI Receiving Centers, and required that participants in the statewide STEMI SOC utilize a department approved national registry platform to collect data.

- **Final Adoption of Amendments to On-site Wastewater Regulations**

Amended regulations to clarify that individual on-site wastewater disposal systems that have both treatment and disposal replaced within 45 days of one another must be considered a replacement, added language to allow for an additional exemption for a single tract of land five acres or larger, and clarified that commercial facilities are not eligible for exemption.

# CHANGES IN STATE LAW

**HOUSE BILL 331.** Signed 03/09/18. Effective 07/01/2018.

- Extended the repealer on the Mississippi Individual On-Site Wastewater Disposal Law, §§41-67-1 et. seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, to July 1, 2023. Clarifies requirements for individual on-site wastewater disposal systems to be considered acceptable. Allows for the payment of certification or registration fees every three years.

**HOUSE BILL 876.** Signed 03/08/18. Effective 07/01/2018.

- Extended the repealer on the Child Death Review Panel, §41-111-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, to July 1, 2021.

**HOUSE BILL 880.** Signed 03/08/18. Effective 07/01/2018.

- Extended the repealer on the requirement for Nursing Home Administrator Licensure, §73-17-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, to July 1, 2021.

**HOUSE BILL 1182.** Signed 03/19/2018. Effective 07/01/2018

- Amended several sections of the law governing emergency medical technicians, §§41-59-1 et. seq, Mississippi Code of 1972, to change references from emergency medical technician-intermediate to emergency medical technician-advanced.

**HOUSE BILL 1333.** Signed 03/16/18. Effective upon passage.

- Created the Mississippi Honey Producers Advisory Council, to include two staff members from the Mississippi State Department of Health, to review the laws and regulations governing the production of honey in Mississippi to determine if the laws and regulations need revision. The Council was required to reports its findings and recommendations to the Chairmen of the Senate and House Agriculture Committees by November 30, 2018.

**HOUSE BILL 1510.** Signed 03/19/2018. Effective upon passage.

- Prohibits abortion if the probable gestational age has been determined to be greater than 15 weeks, except in cases of a medical emergency or in the case of a severe fetal abnormality.

**SENATE BILL 2463.** Signed 03/19/2018. Effective upon passage.

- Requires MSDH to cooperate with the University Of Mississippi Medical Center, as the lead agency, together with the Division of Medicaid and the Mississippi Health Information Network to prepare a comprehensive report on the state of rare diseases in Mississippi. The report shall be presented to the Chairs of the House Public Health and Human Services Committee, Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, and the House and Senate Medicaid Committees no later than December 1, 2019.

**SENATE BILL 2892.** Signed 03/21/2018. Effective upon passage.

- Amended the following sections of the Mississippi Controlled Substances Act: §41-29-113, Mississippi Code of 1972, to revise Schedule I of the Controlled Substances Act to include Furanyl Fentanyl and U-477700, and to exclude cannabidiol from control if it is contained in an FDA-approved drug or is obtained under Section 41-29-136 (Harper Grace's Law). §41-29-115 was amended to add To Schedule II Dronabinol oral solution and Thiafentanil.



BEFORE AGE 75, MISSISSIPPI RESIDENTS, 2017




### INFANT MORTALITY IN MISSISSIPPI, 2007–2017



### AIDS RATES BY YEAR, UNITED STATES AND MISSISSIPPI, 2006–2016



UNITED STATES AND MISSISSIPPI, 2007-2017




## VACCINATION COVERAGE AMONG CHILDREN 19-35 MONTHS, BY YEAR, MISSISSIPPI AND UNITED STATES







## FUNDING SOURCES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018 EXPENDITURES






