Current Marijuana Use Among Mississippi Adults in 2020

The Mississippi Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is conducted annually to monitor the prevalence of behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of morbidity and mortality among adults in our state. The 2020 Mississippi BRFSS was completed by 6,479 Mississippians aged 18 years or older.

Marijuana Use in the United States

- Marijuana is the **most used** federally-illegal drug in the United States.¹
- About 48 million people used marijuana at least once in the U.S. in 2019.¹
- Marijuana use can negatively affect brain health, cardiovascular health, respiratory health, and mental health.^{1,2}
- It is estimated that between 9% and 30% of people who use marijuana may develop marijuana use disorder.²

Self-Reported Marijuana Use in Mississippi in 2020

- Approximately 1 in 11 adults (9.2%) were current marijuana users.³
- The percentage of current marijuana users who used marijuana for non-medical reasons (48.3%) was significantly higher than those who used marijuana for medical reasons or for both medical and non-medical reasons.³ (Figure 1)
- The percentage of current marijuana users was **significantly higher** among **males** (12.9%) compared to females (5.8%).³ (Figure 2)




Figure 3. Percent of Current Marijuana Use by Race, MS, 2020

- The percentage of current marijuana users was significantly higher among Black respondents (13.2%) compared to White respondents (6.4%).³ (Figure 3)
- The percentage of current marijuana users was **significantly higher** among **Black males** (19.8%) compared to other race/gender groups.³ (Figure 1)

Figure 1. Percentage of Adult Current Marijuana Users by Reason for Use, Mississippi, 2020


Definitions

- A current marijuana user is defined as an adult who has used marijuana during the last 30 days.
- In this report, "current marijuana users" refers to adults who reported current marijuana use.
- In this report, "Other Race" refers to adults who reported their race/ethnicity as anything other than White or Black Non-Hispanic or any race and Hispanic.
- The difference between two estimates is considered statistically significant (also stated as "significantly higher/lower" or "significant" in this fact sheet) if the 95% confidence intervals do not overlap.

Current Marijuana Use Among Mississippi Adults in 2020

Self-Reported Marijuana Use in Mississippi in 2020 (continued)

- The percentage of current marijuana users was **significantly higher** among those **aged 18 to 24 years** (21.4%) **and** those **aged 25 to 34 years** (18.3%) compared to all other age groups.³ (Figure 5)
- The percentage of current marijuana users was **significantly lower** among adults who have **graduated from college** (4.4%) compared to those with lower educational attainment.³ (Figure 6)





Figure 7. Percent of Current Marijuana Use by Annual Household Income, MS, 2020

- The percentage of current marijuana users was significantly higher among adults who belonged to annual household income groups of less than \$35,000 compared to those with an annual household income of \$50,000 or more.³ (Figure 7)

Figure 6. Percent of Current Marijuana Use by Education, MS, 2020



Marijuana Use Trends in Mississippi

• The percentage of adults who were current marijuana users **significantly increased** from **5.9%** in 2016 to **9.2%** in 2020.³ (Figure 8)
