

## Research/Data Analyst II Contract Position, Full-Time

The Office of State Health Planning and Research is seeking a candidate for a Research/Data Analyst II position. This role involves conducting advanced data analysis and research to support statewide population health initiatives. The ideal candidate will work as part of a collaborative team to evaluate public health data, identify emerging trends, and inform the development of health policy.

The Research/Data Analyst II will collect, manage, analyze, and interpret health-related data from various sources. The analyst will prepare statistical reports and visualizations to support health policy planning, program evaluation, and stakeholder engagement. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Conducting descriptive and inferential statistical analyses of health indicators such as chronic disease prevalence, maternal and child health outcomes, and health disparities.
- Assisting in the development and maintenance of dashboards and reports that track statewide and regional population health metrics.
- Supporting the preparation of grant applications, legislative reports, and publications through data extraction and technical writing.
- Collaborating with internal and external partners to ensure the integrity, relevance, and timeliness of health data used in decision-making.
- Ensuring compliance with state and federal data confidentiality standards and best practices in data management.

**Preferred Qualifications**: The ideal candidate for this position should possess a bachelor's degree and 2-4 years of relevant experience. Candidates should have strong analytical skills, attention to detail, and proficiency in statistical software, with experience working with large datasets related to public health or healthcare.
