




# 2012-2013 Influenza Report Week 01

December 30 – January 5, 2013

## About our flu activity reporting

MSDH relies upon selected sentinel health practitioners across the state to report the percentage of non-trauma visits consistent with an influenza-like illness (ILI: fever of 100°F or higher AND cough and/or sore throat). Also, providers are supplied with specimen collection kits. Samples are submitted to the Mississippi Public Health Laboratory for influenza PCR testing. Reports are used to estimate the state’s ILI rate and the magnitude of the state’s influenza activity. Reports represent only the distribution of flu in the state, not an actual count of all flu cases statewide. **Information is provisional only and may change depending on additional reporting from sentinel providers.**

## State ILI Surveillance



For week **01** (12/30/2012-01/05/2013), the overall state ILI rate (**9.4%**) **decreased** from last week (**13.3%**), but was **higher** than this time last year (**3.6%**). |



During week **01**, **one** district (3) had an increase in ILI activity, while **six** districts (2, 4, 6, 7, 8, and 9) had a decrease. **Two** districts (1 and 5) remained about the same. *Information is provisional only and may change depending on additional reporting from sentinel providers.* | **Table 2**




Since week 35, the number of reported ILI cases has been highest among people in the **5 to 24 years** of age group, followed by those in the 0


Mississippi ILI Rates 2010-2013 | **Figure 4**



### Flu testing Reports

From week **35** (week ending September 1<sup>st</sup>) through week **01** (week ending January 5<sup>th</sup>), **108** positive influenza samples were identified by MSDH. 102 were influenza A and 6 were influenza B. Ninety-six were subtyped as influenza A (H3) and five were subtyped as influenza A (H1). One sample did not have subtyping performed.


The influenza cases were identified from the following counties: Calhoun, Carroll, Chickasaw (4), Clarke (2), Copiah (2), Covington (4), DeSoto, Harrison (8), Hinds (8), Itawamba, Jefferson Davis (5), Kemper (2), Lamar (5), Lauderdale, Lawrence, Lee (3), Leflore (3), Marion (4), Marshall (14), Monroe (6), Neshoba (2), Oktibbeha (6), Rankin (5), Sharkey, Tate (4), Tishomingo (2), Union (2), Washington (7), and Yazoo (3). | **Figure 5**




**National ILI Surveillance**

**Nationally**, there were **two** influenza-associated pediatric deaths reported to CDC during week **01**. One death was associated with an influenza A (H3) virus and occurred during week 52 (week ending December 29<sup>th</sup>). The second death was associated with an influenza A virus for which the subtype was not determined and occurred during week 01 (week ending January 5<sup>th</sup>). The total number of influenza-associated pediatric deaths reported during the 2012-2013 season is **20**. Level of Flu Activity	Definition
<b>No Activity</b>	Overall clinical activity remains low and there are no lab confirmed cases.
<b>Sporadic</b>	Isolated cases of lab confirmed influenza in the state; ILI activity is not increased <u>OR</u> A lab-confirmed outbreak in a single institution in the state; ILI activity is not increased.
<b>Local</b>	Increased ILI within a single region <b>AND</b> recent (within the past 3 weeks) laboratory evidence of influenza in that region. ILI activity in other regions is not increased <u>OR</u> two of more institutional outbreaks (ILI or lab confirmed) within a single region <b>AND</b> recent (within the past 3 weeks) lab confirmed influenza in that region. Other regions do not have increased ILI and virus activity is no greater than sporadic in those regions
<b>Regional</b>	Increased ILI in at least 2 regions but fewer than half of the regions <b>AND</b> recent (within the past 3 weeks) lab confirmed influenza in the affected regions <u>OR</u> Institutional outbreaks (ILI or lab confirmed) in at least 2 regions but fewer than half of the regions <b>AND</b> recent lab confirmed influenza in the affected regions.
<b>Widespread</b>	Increased ILI and/or institutional outbreaks (ILI or lab confirmed) in at least half of the regions <b>AND</b> recent (within the past 3 weeks) lab confirmed influenza in the state.






