What is the Covid-19  
Community  
Vaccination Program,  
or CCVP?

- The Covid-19 Community Vaccination Program is a program in your community that allows trusted medical professionals to partner with local entities, such as schools, to provide Covid-19 vaccinations. This allows for your community health professional to come into your setting and offer the Covid Vaccination with little to no disruption to your daily schedule.

Our Mission: Partner with community health professionals to remove barriers. Providing the opportunity to eligible school aged adolescents to be vaccinated.



Your participation matters in helping vaccinate all eligible Mississippians.



# Adopt-a-school

When a local provider partners with an adopted school, barriers are removed.

- All students 12 years old and above have access to vaccinations regardless of socioeconomic status
- Parents do not have to search or disrupt normal routines to locate appropriate vaccine and provider
- Schools can choose dates that best accommodate the school schedule



## What is required from a CCVP Provider?

- \* Focus on vaccinations with high vulnerability indexes, high Covid-19 case burdens, and/or low Covid-19 vaccination rates.
- \* Provider is required to partner with community organizations.
  - Social organizations
  - Schools (Adopt-a-School)
  - Faith-based organizations
  - YMCA/YWCA's
  - School Organizations
  - Meal Delivery Services
  - Senior Centers
- \* Provide Vaccinations outside of normal clinic operations
- \* Provider is responsible for reporting and storing vaccination data.



## What we need from Partnering Schools:

- Partnership to ensure appropriate school age children have access to the Covid-19 Vaccine.
- Help obtaining consent from parental guardians.
- Designation of space for a Pop-up clinic at your location.
- Support from trusted members of the educational community.



## School Perks for Having the Vaccinated Populations:

- When fully vaccinated, you can return to activities you participated in prior to the pandemic.
- No mask or physical distancing required unless required by set regulations by law, rule, or workplace guidance.
- Keep the learning environment safe for in-person learning.
- Lower the risk of transmission and lessen side effects if contracted.
- If exposed to COVID-19 no quarantine is necessary keeping students and staff fully engaged.
