Introduction

The goal of the Mississippi Trauma Care System is to deliver the **right** patient to the **right** hospital the **first** time. Research shows that this approach decreases mortality. Trauma remains the leading cause of death for Mississippians age 1 to 44 and Mississippi ranks third in the nation for unintentional injury deaths.

Mississippi began development of a statewide trauma system in 1991. The Mississippi Legislature charged the Mississippi State Department of Health with the responsibility for oversight of trauma system development. Since that time the state has adopted a trauma care plan, established seven designated trauma regions, designated qualifying hospitals as trauma centers, maintains a trauma registry, and disbursed funding to trauma regions, trauma centers, and physicians.

The Mississippi Legislature passed House Bill 1405 during the 2007 Regular Session to revitalize and more fully fund the Mississippi Trauma Care System. Mississippi moved from a voluntary system with indigent reimbursement, to a mandatory system with block grant funding based on participation; the first trauma system of its type in the United States. As suggested by the Mississippi Trauma Care Task Force, this report on the Mississippi Trauma Care System will be submitted quarterly to the Mississippi State Board of Health.

Trauma Center Designations:

The following Level IV Trauma Centers were designated during this period:

- Calhoun Health Services, Calhoun City
- King's Daughters Hospital, Yazoo City
- Marion General Hospital, Columbia
- Merit Health Rankin, Brandon (formerly Crossgates River Oaks)
- Neshoba County General Hospital, Philadelphia
- North MS Medical Center-Eupora
- North MS Medical Center-West Point
- Perry County Hospital, Richton
- Quitman County Hospital, Marks
- Scott Regional Hospital, Morton
- Simpson General Hospital, Mendenhall
- Wayne County General Hospital, Waynesboro

Currently, the system is comprised of:

- Three (3) Level I Trauma Centers (UMMC, Jackson; Regional Medical Center, Memphis; University of South Alabama, Mobile);
- One (1) stand-alone Tertiary Pediatric Trauma Center (Le Bonheur Children's Hospital, Memphis);
- Three (3) Level II Trauma Centers (North Mississippi Medical Center, Tupelo; Forrest General Hospital, Hattiesburg; Memorial Hospital of Gulfport, Gulfport);
- Sixteen (16) Level III Trauma Centers;
- Sixty two (62) Level IV Trauma Centers; and
- One Burn Center (J.M. Still at Merit Health Central).

Mississippi Trauma Advisory Committee (MTAC) Activities:

MTAC held its quarterly meeting on February 11, 2015. The committee addressed the following issues:

- Discussed Trauma Center diversion/by-pass and recommended the Trauma Rules & Regulations/Functionality Sub-committee work to define and develop diversion criteria.
- Discussed implementation of a five tier system of Trauma Centers. Levels I-III would not change; Level IV would have 24/7 general surgical coverage but not would not 24/7 Orthopedic Surgical capability. Level V Trauma Centers would be the same as the current

Level IV designation, i.e., stabilize and transfer facilities. MTAC recommended the Trauma Financial Sub-committee and the Trauma Rules & Regulations/Functionality Sub-committee review and propose regulations for the composition of the five levels.

- MTAC requested for members to be on the Trauma Financial Sub-committee and asked for volunteers to be chair and members of the Trauma Education and Prevention Sub-committee.
- MTAC approved the Burn inclusion criteria for the State Trauma Registry as presented by the Trauma Registry Subcommittee and the Burn Committee.
- The ongoing project to link EMS pre-hospital data with the Trauma Registry is near completion. The test between the two vendors (EMS-Image Trend, Registry-Digital Innovations) has been completed and the software will be updated at the next scheduled enhancement. Additionally, MTAC recommended to the EMS Advisory Council that selected pre-hospital data be mandatory for EMS reports to facilitate collection requirements.

The next meeting of MTAC is scheduled for May 13, 2015.






Age and Gender




The top 7 mechanisms of injury




Work related injuries




ATV Injuries and Deaths



ATV Injuries and Deaths with Protective Devices (Pediatric)




ATV Injuries and Deaths with Protective Devices (Adult)



Trauma Performance Improvement (PI) Program:

- The Trauma PI sub-committee met on January 22, 2015. The sub-committee completed the discussion of recurring findings from Trauma Center inspection reports and used the criteria checklist for Level II and Level III Trauma Centers to develop the following:
 - Segregated each criterion into clinical or programmatic categories.
 - Using the American College of Surgeon (ACS) guidelines, the committee assigned either Type I (critical) or Type II (non-critical) status to each criterion.
- This inspection report will be finalized and used with developing an inspection report for Level I Trauma Centers.
- The committee also approved having a formal State Trauma Performance Improvement Plan developed and to be presented to the sub-committee for approval.
- The next meeting is scheduled for April 16, 2015 (not a public meeting).
