#### Introduction

The goal of the Mississippi Trauma Care System is to deliver the *right* patient to the *right* hospital at the *right* time. Research shows that this approach decreases mortality. Trauma remains the leading cause of death for Mississippians age 1 to 44 and Mississippi ranks third in the nation for unintentional injury deaths.

Mississippi began development of a statewide trauma system in 1991. The Mississippi Legislature charged the Mississippi State Department of Health with the responsibility for oversight of trauma system development. Since that time the state has adopted a trauma care plan, established seven designated trauma regions, designated qualifying hospitals as trauma centers, maintains a trauma registry, and disbursed funding to trauma regions, trauma centers, and physicians.

The Mississippi Legislature passed House Bill 1405 during the 2007 Regular Session to revitalize and more fully fund the Mississippi Trauma Care System. Mississippi moved from a voluntary system with indigent reimbursement, to a mandatory system with block grant funding based on participation; the first trauma system of its type in the United States. As suggested by the Mississippi Trauma Care Task Force, this report on the Mississippi Trauma Care System will be submitted quarterly to the Mississippi State Board of Health.

- Three (3) Level I Trauma Centers (UMMC, Jackson; Regional Medical Center, Memphis; University of South Alabama, Mobile);
- Four (4) Level II Trauma Centers (North Mississippi Medical Center, Tupelo; Forrest General Hospital, Hattiesburg; Memorial Hospital of Gulfport, Gulfport; Singing River Hospital, Pascagoula);

- Thirteen (13) Level III Trauma Centers; and
- Sixty (63) Level IV Trauma Centers.

## Mississippi Trauma Advisory Committee (MTAC) Activities:

MTAC held its quarterly meeting on May 16, 2012 in the Cobb Auditorium:

- The Rules and Regulations sub-committee reviewed submitted numerous rules for changes as well as one new rule:
  - Rule 1.4.3 Trauma Registrars Trauma centers must have sufficient staffing to ensure submissions are accurate and ontime.
  - The sub-committee also recommended a new consolidated Essentials and Desirables (E&D) Chart for equipment at each level of adult Trauma Center and Pediatric Trauma Center. The chart will be maintained on the MSDH Trauma website.
- MTAC requested a report from both the MEMSIS and Trauma Registry User Committees on the integration of MEMSIS data with the Trauma Registry.


## Injury Severity Score (ISS) Summary for Level I-III Trauma Centers




## Age and Gender




The top 7 mechanisms of injury




#### Work related injuries




#### ATV injuries with Protective Devices/Equipment

#### Performance Improvement (PI) Program:

The State Trauma PI Committee has been restructured into the State PI Committee. Mr. Bill Oliver will be the State PI Coordinator and co-chair of the individual PI sub-committees: Trauma, STEMI, and eventually, Stroke.

#### Trauma PI Sub-committee activities:


Dr. John Porter has been selected as the chairman of the Trauma Subcommittee, replacing Dr. Frank Ehrlich. Meetings are being held bi-monthly (odd numbered months) instead of semi-annually.

- The sub-committee met on March 13 and May 22, 2012.
- Discussion items relating to system performance:
  - EMS arrival at scene to departure to ED (scene time) should be less than 15 minutes, excluding extrications.
  - A maximum of 24 hours for the hospital to receive an EMS run sheet.
  - Appropriate use of CT at Level IV and III centers prior to transfer.
  - Deaths occurring at receiving hospitals after transfer.
  - Unexpected death where the patient should have survived (TRISS > .5).
  - ED Length of Stay in Level III/IV centers prior to transfer should be less than 130 minutes.
  - Transfer of pediatric Alpha trauma patients to Tertiary Pediatric Trauma Centers.

#### **STEMI PI Sub-committee activities:**

The Mississippi Health Care Alliance (MHCA) is soliciting nominations from their membership to fill the positions on the STEMI System Advisory Committee (counterpart to MTAC) and the STEMI PI Sub-committee. Appointments will be announced at the MHCA statewide meeting in August, 2012.
